Dear Jafar: I saved a kitty from the middle of the street but I have never had one before. How can I tell what he is thinking?

Most people, including pet owners, are poor cat face readers, shows a study. Despite the popularity of cats, as anyone who has been around a cat knows, reading cats is not always an easy task. While cats may seem mysterious, their behavior can help us to understand how they are feeling. The position of a cat's body, head, ears and tail are all telltale hints. An anxious or fearful cat may crouch down

to the ground, arch its back, lower its head and flatten its ears. Fearful or anxious cats may also retreat backwards in avoidance, hide themselves, make their fur stand on edge – known as piloerection, growl, hiss, spit, swat or bite. Conversely, a content cat may approach you with their tail up, with their body and head in a neutral position and their ears forward. When resting, they may tuck their paws in, or lay on their side with their legs stretched out. This chart might be helpful.

I have lots of cat friends in the office and at Ernie's apartment next door and I am sure glad I know how to read pussycat body language. It makes it easier to live around here because Ernie has lots of pussycats.

## RECENT RESCUES

Flat Foot is a tiny kitty that came in with a foot that looked like a pancake. He was found roaming the streets covered in fleas and missing hair. After immediate amputation, he started to do well and is now awaiting a ride on transport to Wisconsin soon. **Patches** was found on the streets of Banquete, TX a skeleton infected with mange, fleas, and heartworms and a skin infection from hell. It took months to get her well and cured of heartworms, but she recently went up north to a wonderful new home. Red was found with his right eye hanging out of the socket with a bad infection. He underwent eye removal surgery and,

after antibiotics, went to Wisconsin to live happily ever after. **Bruce** was found wandering the streets of Robstown with a tumor the size of a basketball. After it was removed and he had time to heal, he found a wonderful home. Christi is a hound dog that was found on Ayers suffering of anemia, mange, malnutrition, and the worst yeast infection I have ever seen. After three months of medicated baths, good food, and antibiotics, she traveled to the East Coast where she is a loved family member. Susie was covered in sarcoptic mange, which is painful and she was scared to death upon arrival. We also had to put her on Prozac to improve her mental health.

After treatment for the mange, she grew her hair back and after months on Prozac, she learned how to be a happy dog and went to New York where she found a wonderful new life. These 2 guinea pigs were let loose at Cole Park, and

a father/son team chased them and caught them. The little male got fixed at Everhart Animal Hospital and in 30 days he can be reunited with his girlfriend. I hope God gets back at the bad people that abandoned them. This Street Kitty was found by a good Samaritan walking around the neighborhood with a tumor the size of an apricot. Once removed, he went up north to a happy new life as an indoor loved family member. Bus Stop was found after being hit by a city bus on Morgan, laying with a mangled rear leg. A nurse coming off her shift at Spohn Shoreline rushed him to us. The bleeding was stopped, an amputation was done, and he now lives in New York and sleeps in bed with a little girl. Snowflake an emaciated pup was found in the west side of Corpus wandering the streets. She had parvo, which she survived with good care, meds, and IV fluids. She got well and after 2 months went to Michigan where she now lives with a family of her own. Mo and Jeff were left in a closed box in a park when a visitor heard them screaming. They were brought to us where after a cold bath and water recuperated nicely from overheating in the summer heat. They are now awaiting a new home. Marcell, a small dog, was found dragging a torn up rear leg in Edroy, TX. A good Samaritan brought

After hospitalization and an amputation, he is enjoying his life in Rochester, NY. Moochie a senior chihuahua came to us when the owner became homeless. She had an abdominal tumor the size of a softball and could hardly walk. After surgery and a dental, she went to Canada where she

lives like a queen.

Every time I think of each dog's story that comes through our doors and all the wonderful outcomes, I feel like I am already in Heaven. There is nothing else I'd rather be doing in this world. So, I thank all of you, our donors, for the opportunity to live such a sweet, fulfilled life, and hope to continue doing this for many years to come. Thank you, thank you, thank you!
